



St. Francis of Assisi Pray for Us!



October 4th is the feast day of St. Francis of Assisi. Vocation to the religious life is a unique call from God. St. Francis was born in Assisi, Italy, to a wealthy family in 1811. As he was getting older he became bright, popular and athletic.

Later, St. Francis heard the voice of Christ and followed Christ very intimately by living a true Gospel life. He imitated Christ's life and embraced a life of poverty, chastity, and obedience. He spent much of his time in prayer and meditation. Gradually, he began to attract other young men by his spiritual enthusiasm and renunciation. St. Francis became the founder of the Franciscan Order.

St. Francis was a man of prayer, He loved poor people and he saw Christ in them. Once he gave his own cloak to a beggar who was standing in the cold. Even though people avoided approaching lepers, St. Francis kissed

a leper because he saw Christ in that leper.

St. Francis was torn between a life devoted entirely to prayer and a life of active preaching of the Good News.

During the last years of his relatively short life, Francis was half blind and seriously ill. Two years before his death he received the stigmata, the real and painful wounds of Christ in his hands, feet and side.

On his deathbed, St. Francis said over and over again the last addition to his Canticle of the Sun, "Be praised, O Lord, for our Sister Death." He sang Psalm 141, and at the end asked his superior's permission to have his clothes removed when the last hour came in order that he could expire lying naked on the earth, in imitation of his Lord. He

died at the age of 44.

St. Mother Teresa who lived for the poorest of the poor, as she walked

and walked, until she couldn't walk anymore she prayed to God in search of a shelter where the abandoned poor ones could get some food, medicine and a place to stay. She described her mission and her house which she desired for the comfort of poor:

- "My house is that of the poor - of the poorest among the poor;
- of those one tries to avoid for fear of contagion and dirtiness, because they are covered with microbes and and worms:

- of those who do not go to pray, because one cannot go out of one's house naked;
- of those who do not eat anymore, because they have no strength for eating;
- of those who fall down on the streets, knowing that they are going to die, and at whose side pedestrians pass and don't look back:
- Of those who do not weep anymore, because they have run out of tears; of the untouchable."

POPE FRANCIS' PRAYER INTENTIONS:


OCTOBER
