THE LAST LETTERS OF REV. JOHN MARY JACQUET

The life of Rev. John M. Jacquet, pastor of Batesville St. Mary and later at Coshocton in the Diocese of Columbus, has been described more than once in the pages of the <u>Bulletin</u>. To him, in human terms, can probably be ascribed the development of the religious vocation of Most Rev. Nicholas Gallagher, Bishop of Galveston. Now we are grateful that a new member of the Society, Miss Mary Agnes McCabe, a grand-niece of the bishop, has provided to us copies of five letters which the venerable Father Jacquet wrote to her mother during his last years. Three of these are of some interest from either the historical or biographical perspective and will be published as space permits. The first of them was written while he was still pastor of Coshocton and its missions.

Miss Mary Gallagher

Dear Mary

I thank you for your very interesting letter of yesterday. I am glad you inform me of the death of poor James McGuire. I will say Mass in a few days for the repose of his soul. Thank God I am well; have not been sick; but some times not as well as usual.

The grippe has been so plenty here, that every sickness is called grippe. I suppose Mr. Peter Armbruster like myself is not very young now, and they say for old people the grippe is harder. Uncle John was never very strong. I wrote to him some time ago I think twice, and got no answer; I think I will not write again.

I am surprised that uncle James gets only \$8,00 pension. Here lots of soldiers who did less service than James get \$12,00 and more; and the widows get \$12,00. Mrs. Funk gets \$12,00 and many others. Give all the uncles my best regards; I often think of them. In a few months I will be 75 years of age; but my health keeps good. I have much need of it. We are commencing a church at Spring Mountain; I forget if you have been there; I rather think you have. The Church of Killbuck is getting too small, and is out of the way, as your old church was.

Have you seen the church of Wills Creek. [Coshocton Co.] It is a great blessing to the Catholics of W.C. On a fair Sunday it is almost

full. It is so much better for me than the two old mud holes! I went there last Sunday in 75 minutes! The church of Spring Mountain will be her sister, built alike only 5 feet shorter; we have already commenced; it will be the 4th and last church I built.

When I left St. Mary's 23 years ago, I had commenced talking about a church in Barnsville but had not commenced working. Give my best compliments to Father Montag. Tell him if our new RR. gets finished in my days I will ask him to come here at the 40 hours devotions. Here they push it very hard. The bridge starts from this side of the river and goes all the way across the canal; it must be more than half a mile long. There are 10 stone piers and a long trestel. They say the road will be finished by the 4 of July. I dont expect to go to the dedication; but if the new road is finished in my time, I will be sure to go. It will be only 50 miles; and we will go in 2 hours, and no change of car, and no waiting for connections, that will be grand. I am very glad that you have a new church; you had need of it. Coshocton is growing, come and see us, you will be surprised! I suppose you don't think of Kentucky I still think you would have made a splendid sister.

CHRONICLE OF EVENTS IN THE DIOCESE FOR 1989

Universal Church

Jan. 30. Pope John Paul II's apostolic exhortation on the laity, Christifideles Laici, was released.

Dec. The Vatican sent to the world's bishops the first draft of the projected new universal catechism, the first which will be completed since the Roman Catechism of 1566.

Diocese of Columbus

- Feb. 11. A Tridentine Rite Mass was offered at St. Charles Prepatory School in Columbus, with approval of the Bishop. A second Tridentine Rite Mass was offered at St. Teresa Shrine Center on December 30.
- May 12. Bishop Griffin's pastoral letter on aging, "A Mission to Fulfill", was released.

Parishes

1988 The parishes of Shawnee St. Mary and New Straitsville St. Augustine were united as the Community of St. Peter.

Mar. 2. Bishop Griffin announced the consolidation of Corpus Christi and St. Ladislaus elementary schools in Columbus.

Aug. 31 St. Pius V Mission in Moxahala, Perry County, was closed. The last public act was a Mass offered by Bishop Griffin earlier in the month.

- Sept. St. Matthias parish school in Columbus added a kindergarten, located in the former convent.
- Nov. 12. St. Joan of Arc Church, Powell, was solemnly dedicated by Bishop Griffin.

June 26. The new monastery of St. Joseph of the Poor Clares of Perpetual Adoration in Portsmouth was blessed by Bishop Griffin.

Oct. 29. The combination chapel and mausoleum at Resurrection Cemetery north of Columbus was dedicated by Bishop Griffin.

Nov. 26. A black Catholic conference on liturgy was held in Columbus, having been organized by the diocesan Black Catholic Congress coordinating team.

Jan. 23. Sister Anthony Marie Haid, O.P., a member of the community of St. Mary of the Springs, died at St. Anthony Hospital in Columbus at the age of 70 years; she was a native of Martins Ferry, Ohio and had been raised in Delaware, Ohio.

Jan. 28. Sister Adele Clifford of the Sisters of Charity of Cincinnati, age 82, a native of Chillicothe, died at St. Joseph Motherhouse, Cincinnati.

Feb. 12. Monsignor Paul Richter, age 81, a native of Columbus, died in Steubenville.

Feb. 13. Rev. Thomas McLaughlin, pastor of New Albany Resurrection Parish, resigned.

Mar. 9. Sister M. Annette Mumm, of the Sisters of St. Francis of Penance and Charity, the former Lillian Mumm of Columbus, died at the age of 85 years at the house of the Franciscan Sisters of Stella Niagara, Buffalo, N.Y.

Mar. 10. Sister M. Trinitas of the Sisters of Mercy, age 82, died at the Sisters of Mercy Academy, Louisville, Kentucky; she formerly was Margaret Burhard of Columbus.

Mar.12. Sister Teresita, O.P. died at St. Cecilia Convent, Nashville; the former Mary Theresa Casey of Columbus, she had been a member of that congregation since 1929.

Apr. 6. Mark J. Hammond, diocesan seminarian, was ordained a deacon in St. Peter's Basilica, Rome, by Archbishop Quinn of San Francisco.

Apr. 8. Sister Celestine, born Frances Kruse in Columbus, died at the Franciscan motherhouse at Stella Niagara, New York, aged 89 years.

May 1. Monsignor Patrick J. Griffin, Associate Pastor of Christ the King Parish in Columbus, retired.

June 2. Sister Sara Zugschwert, O.P., age 89, a native of Coshocton, died at St. Mary of the Springs.
