




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The above are receipts for five dollars each, paid by Lukas Merkle and Ludwig Keller for lots in the old Catholic Cemetery in Columbus. Merkle bought lot number 58 on October 3, 1847 and Keller purchased lot 36 on February 23, 1849. The Keller receipt bears the signature of Peter Ury, chairman of the cemetery committee for Holy Cross Parish. These receipts were found in the original record book of the cemetery, which had been placed in a drawer with other items to be sorted by the late Monsignor Herman Mattingly, Archivist of the Diocese of Columbus. The book gives us the most complete description yet found of the lots and lot-owners in the old cemetery, now part of the campus of the Columbus State Community College.

OWNERS OF LOTS AND PHYSICAL LAYOUT OF THE COLUMBUS CATHOLIC CEMETERY

The original ledger of the first Columbus Catholic Cemetery, mentioned above, contains six series of records:

- a nine-page list of lot owners, with each lot represented by a square; the bottom half of each of the first six pages is re-numbred in pencil.
- a six-page ledger dated from November 20, 1846, titled "Das Gemein Platz auf dem Katholischen Kirchhof in Columbus." That is, the common place or the single grave section of the Catholic Graveyard in Columbus. It contains a record in German of payments made for single graves to February, 1851.
- the ledger continues on the next eleven pages to July, 1858, with the heading, "Handed over by Mr. Peter Uri to me C. H. Borgess the 30th day of June" (1851). This section is in English. The Holy Cross Parish books previously in possession of the Society continue the ledger from October of 1859.
- A second list of names of lot-owners in the graveyars. In the rear of the book are:
 - A list of payments to Fathers Schonatt and Borgess on the graveyard, Oct. 21, 1846 to Oct. 7, 1851.
 - A record of money not returned to the church. That is, money in the graveyard account spent directly on items for the church, school, and graveyard, such as candles, oil, digging graves, fencing, etc.

The first list of lot owners is not only a list. The squares in which the owners' names are written are a map of the physical arrangement of the lots. This is made obvious by the listing of the four lots where the central cross was located. It also is obvious from the re-numbering of the lots on the bottom halves of the first six pages and the fact that the lots on the upper halves of these pages do not appear in the second list of lot-owners. These changes represent the division of the graveyard between the German (Holy Cross) and Irish (St. Patrick) parishes, effected by Archbishop Purcell about 1854. He divided the graveyard by a line drawn down the center, running directly through the central cross. Another indication that the list represents the physical arrangement of lots is the penciled notes on the bottom of parts of the fourth and fifth pages indicating where two additional tiers of lots were laid out.

The following list has been assembled from all available sources, the primary one being the old ledger. Lot numbers in parentheses represent the new numbers, after the division of the graveyard, of those lots which remained under the control of Holy Cross Parish. Where known, dates of purchase or payment are indicated.



SINGLE GRAVES IN THE OLD CATHOLIC CEMETERY, 1847-1851

This record was made largely for accounting purposes, so that the dates given often are a little later than the death or burial itself. Included here are only those names which do not appear in the Holy Cross burial register. The name given is often that of a parent or other responsible person, not that of the deceased. The records through February of 1851 were written in German, by a man (perhaps Mr. Ury) who did not know English. Thus, the names John and James appear as Schun and Schims. Likewise, some of the names which cannot be recognized may be German phonetic spellings of surnames. In some cases, no attempt was made at spelling the last name, but the word "Eirisch", the German phonetic spelling of "Irish," was written. Most such instances do not appear in this list, for they can be identified from the Holy Cross Parish burial register. For the names in that register and in the later continuation of the financial account lists, see The Columbus Catholic Cemetery: History and Records, 1846-1874 by Donald M. Schlegel. In the list below, "cg" indicates a child grave.
