

1300.0 - Facility Inspections

In order to assure that our facilities are well maintained and comply with applicable safety laws, the following policies and guidelines are in effect for each Diocesan entity which has responsibility for one or more facilities:
1301.0 - Facility Inspection
1302.0 - Reserve Study
1303.0 - Jarod's Law
It is recommended that each entity establish a sub-committee of their Finance Council to provide the entity with council related to facilities issues.

1301.0 - Periodic Inspection of Facilities

It is the responsibility of each entity of the Diocese of Columbus to assure that their physical facilities and equipment are maintained to assure that they will be available to future generations of the faithful.

Every entity should establish a set schedule for inspection of their facilities and correction of any maintenance issues uncovered during the inspection.

An example of a plan follows. Please note that some of the elements listed below will not apply to all entities. In addition, entities may have additional elements that need to be added. A template is provided (**policy 1813.0**) that can be modified for individual Diocesan Entity.

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Policy Guideline

1302.0 - Reserve Study
A Reserve Study is a comprehensive review of all facilities and major equipment at a location for the purpose of establishing a reserve fund for the replacement or repair of the entity's facilities and major equipment.
It is recommended that all entities have a Reserve Study performed to establish a schedule of major repair and replacement projects at their respective locations.
This study should be performed by a competent firm which employs individuals who have earned the Professional Reserve Analyst and/or the Reserve Specialist designation. Firms offering this service can be found through the Association of Professional Reserve Analysts (www.apra-usa.com).
A particularly important benefit of a Reserve Study is the recommendation of the amount of funds that should be set aside each year to fund future major maintenance.
In addition to providing a guide to what will be necessary to establish and maintain such a fund, following this methodology will spread out the cost of future repairs and replacements over many years instead of incurring the costs in a single year as the work is performed.
It is highly recommended that all Diocesan entities give budgetary consideration to establishing and funding a reserve for this purpose.



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1303.0 - Jarod's Law

Jarod's Law Background Information

Jarod's Law became effective in March of 2007. It is named for a first grade student named Jarod Bennett, whose accidental death was caused by a folding cafeteria table that had fallen on him.

This law requires schools and other diocesan institutions to establish and implement safety policies and procedures summarized below.

- Creation of the School Health and Safety Network.
- School inspections for unsafe health, safety, and sanitation conditions by the Ohio State Board of Health.
- Published inspection reports for each school.
- Mandatory written plans, including timeframes, for remediation of each item identified as not within compliance by the inspection.
- Review of school remediation plans, by the Boards of Health, to ensure proper compliance.
- Auditing and review by the State of Ohio Auditor's Office to ensure the overall integrity of the School Health and Safety Network Program.
