

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St. John Bosco's Feast day is on January 31st. In 1841 he ordained to the priesthood in Turin, Italy. He was known as the "Father of Youth" because he dedicated his life for the betterment of the youths. He established many boarding houses for the poor boys. He worked tirelessly for reforming them as a need of that time. Many of the youths were lived in streets and imprisoned in the jail due to immoral life, poverty, abandonment, and hardships.

Fr. John Bosco gathered all the street children and he guided them to live in a moral life. He taught them about the purpose and meaning in life. They experienced God's love and care for them through his advises and his exemplary life. He often reminded them: "Fly from bad companions as from the bite of a poisonous snake". He influenced them by his works of charity, kindness,

food. He inspired them to follow Christ and devotion to Blessed Mother. He entrusted his youths to Blessed Mother's maternal care and love. He also taught them to work hard instead of living in idleness and laziness.

Also he taught them that, "Health is God's great gift, and we must spend it entirely for Him. Our eyes should see only for God, our feet walk only for Him, our hands labor for Him alone; in short, our entire body should serve God while we still have the time. Then, when He shall take our health and we shall near our last day, our conscience will not reproach us for having misused it".

He is the founder of Salesian Congregation. In all the continents the Salesian men and women religious Fathers and Sisters ministering and fostering the life of youth. It is very amazing that how marvelously spread the Salesian Mission in all over the world. is the guide and refuge of sinners. The greatest youth saint, Dominic Savio, who lived in the boarding with St. John Bosco.

St. John Bosco is a great advocate for all youth because he lived, worked, and loved for them for the greater glory of the souls. Salesian Fathers and Sisters ministering for the poor, and neediest young people in the schools, parishes, boarding schools, technical schools. They do the mission work very passionately to build the Church of Christ through opening doors to the youth to grow in love of God and find meaning in their lives as they are the horizons of future.

John Bosco promoted education for the youths and he stated, advocates: "If young people are educated properly, we have moral order; if not, vice and disorder prevail". He lived a saintly life until his death. Let us ask his intercession for all the youths.
